- The thesis will be of the topic and scope appropriate for the Department of Physics and Astronomy.
- The normal duration of the program is five or six years from the matriculation date.
- The student will be responsible for assembling the thesis advisory committee (TAC) in compliance with the program rules and for meeting the annual deadlines on submitting his or her progress reports and TAC evaluation forms (http://physics-astronomy.jhu.edu/graduate/research-and-advising/).
- If the primary advisor is not a faculty member in the Department of Physics and Astronomy, this form must be co-signed by a co-advisor who is a faculty member in the Department of Physics and Astronomy.
